Who we are

We are Aliança Bíblica Universitária do Brasil (ABUB). A movement of christian students that gathers in schools and universities to witness Jesus. They reach their friends with the gospel and support them in various ways. We also have a movement among professionals.

Our students and professionals understand that where they are right now is where God has called them to sow his message and bear fruit in love.

They're not just passing through; God is already there! ABUB Brazil's structure exists to support them in this mission, with training and development.

We have existed in Brazil since 1957. We are part of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES), which has existed since 1947 and is present in over 180 countries and territories.

We believe that God has a calling for the participants of ABUB Brazil beyond their time as students. A mission field that begins and extends beyond the *campus*! We see their potential to impact churches, work areas, and society through the transformation and reconciliation of the gospel. And we're not just thinking about the ABUB Brazil students!

We believe that God calls all young christians to serve him entirely. That's why we feel it's time to "amanhar", what we called our event.



It's an event that brings together ABUB students and other young christians, as well as various organizations, for moments of training, connection, and dialogue about our missionary perspective. Participants will receive seeds that help them discern God's calling for their lives.

In ABUB's history, we've had events like this in 1976 and 2006, impacting Brazilian churches and missions, as well as within our movement.



By students, for students

"Missão 2026: Amanhar" is being designed by a council composed of staff workers, board members, and students. We expect an average of 400 people, but we have room to grow up to 800! And, of course, people from outside ABUB are also invited.

What do we want to achieve with Missão 2026?

1. Sowing in this generation the hope and reconciliation of Jesus and an integral vision of mission

This means bringing the hope of Jesus into a context of pessimism.

Proclaiming reconciliation in times of polarization.

Reclaiming a comprehensive vision of mission so that this generation acts with missional intentionality from the cross-cultural field, through the church, and into the workplace.

To do this, we want to share a bold training that encourages this generation to see themselves as part of God's mission. We want to bring the hope and reconciliation of Christ to all areas of our lives today (at school or university), in the future (professionally), and into eternity.

We want to teach practical and comprehensive ways of living our faith and mission that are connected to the needs of our reality and the diversity of the body of Christ.

What do we want to achieve with Missão 2026?

2. Connecting people to different missionary and ecclesial branches so they can bear fruit

After spreading the message of mission, we want participants to connect with various mission fields to discern where God is calling them to bear fruit.

To this end, we will create spaces that facilitate these bridges with organizations, groups, and people from diverse backgrounds: churches, mission agencies (urban, cross-cultural etc.), nonprofit organizations, social advocacy groups, professional fields, and artistic sectors.

Furthermore, we want these connections to also be reconciliatory with (and between) groups and organizations. We dream of connections that allow participants to deeply develop their spiritual, vocational, and professional lives.

What do we want to achieve with Missão 2026?

3. Fertilize our movement so we can continue to flourish

In 2027, we will celebrate 70 years of mission and we want, through this congress, to mark a new chapter in our history.

Missão 2026 will impact ABUB by establishing our missionary vision for schools, universities, and professionals among this new generation. Many young people unfamiliar with ABUB will be able to engage in this calling, while others, who already participate, will be able to expand the scope of what they envision as the work of a local ABUB group.

We hope to make the most of our event to develop a new generation of leaders who are enthusiastic and aligned with ABUB. Furthermore, through it, we will be able to invest in and continue our strategic planning.

The connections we make will help us spread the movement in new territories and become known in new groups.

Who are our guests?

In short, young people between 18 and 30 years old who have faith in Jesus Christ and want to learn more about how this faith can impact their careers and future. People who are passionate about Jesus and willing to answer his calling! (Even if it means staying where they are!)

What will we study in Missão 2026?

Scripture plays a central role in ABUB events, and this will be no different at our missionary conference.

We will study biblical texts such as parables, prophecies, and poetry.

Texts that call this generation to **sow** the Kingdom of God, to **bear** fruit, to **harvest**. In sum, to cultivate!
